GORDON GUYER: Insects to Institutions Ten Top Memories at MSU

Beginning as an Entomology professor in 1952, Gordon served the U as chair of that department, then as Director of Cooperative Extension for a decade ('74-'84), when he retired from the U to be the Director of the Michigan Department of Natural Resources under Governor Blanchard. He then returned here as Vice President for Government Affairs from '86 to '92 (replacing the late Jack Breslin), and the Board of Trustees elected him President of the University from '92 to '93, taking the reins from John DiBiaggio and handing them over to Peter McPherson.

Unwilling or unable to retire again, he was appointed by Governor Engler to head

the state's Department of Agriculture from '93 to 96. Gordon told your editor that he neither applied nor was interviewed for any of those positions. He retired in '96 to begin a career hunting and fishing and playing tennis. But his mean left-handed forehand fell to a shoulder injury and we haven't seen him on the court for several years now. Smooth Handoffs

I have enjoyed working with Vice-President Patrick Scheetz so that we, too, can experience a "smooth handoff" at MSURA. I believe that Patrick will bring a high energy leadership style to our association. I also believe that our association will be well-served by his presidency. I look forward to supporting his leadership for MSURA.

John Shinsky, Orphan, Builds an Orphanage

On the 2nd Monday of February, a full house gathered at the Crescent Road branch of the MSU Credit Union, to hear the second installment of an impromptu talk MSU's former defensive tackle (1970-73) gave us when former coach Henry Bullough was our speaker. John Shinsky and three friends bicycled from Spartan Stadium last spring, collecting money on the way from East Lansing to Metamora, Mexico, where he had promised to rebuild a broken down orphanage with the half million dollars they hoped to raise. The trip was a success and "we survived," he told us. Today the City of Children (Ciudad de los Ninos) consists of six buildings, has buses donated by Dean Transportation, and bunk beds from MSU's dormitories. John had a Super Bowl spot lined up to talk about the orphanage, but the earthquake in Haiti put President Obama on TV in his place, asking for funds to house the many orphans that disaster created. He hopes to get a spot if MSU makes the Final Four this spring. It was a great talk with lots of questions from the retirees. The MSURA Board of Directors supports the transition of the MSURA to a not-for-profit corporate form, with the same governance structure and purposes as the current unincorporated association. The goal of incorporation is to limit the liability of MSURA Board members, managers and volunteers in accordance with law and to provide a more formal structure for MSURA's future.
