BUS TOUR OF KELLOGG MANOR AND GILMORE AUTO MUSEUM, APRIL 29,

2019. We are planning a one-day trip on Monday, April 29, and we think you'll love it. We'll first visit the W.K. Kellogg Manor House. This was the Cereal King's Summer Cottage, which was built in 1925-1926. The Kellogg Manor House is a classic example of Tudor Revival architecture overlooking Gull Lake. The interior of the house has bay windows with leaded glass, coffered ceiling, a hand carved oak staircase and renowned Rookwood tile. Lunch will be served to us in the W.K. Kellogg Manor House after our tour. Then we travel to the **Gilmore Car Museum**, which is the largest auto museum in North America with over 180,000 square feet of exhibit space. The museum started in the early 1960s when Donald Gilmore began collecting vintage automobiles, including a 1920 Pierce Arrow, which is still on display.
