MONDAY, APRIL 13, 2020 MEMBERSHIP MEETING WITH DR. RUFUS ISSACS SPEAKING. Dr. Rufus Issacs will be sharing his vast knowledge of honey bees with us. In recent decades the populations have been declining. What can we do to support them? What are the affects on our food crops? Isaacs will answer these questions and more about this important species. Isaacs is a professor and extension specialist in the Department of Entomology at MSU, where he has worked for the past two decades. His research program explores insect ecology and behavior to develop insect management practices for sustainable crop production. Pest management challenges are addressed by testing new reduced-risk insecticides, developing new pest control tools and tactics, and integrating them into established integrated pest management programs. The lab also focuses on crop pollination, with emphasis on the biology and conservation of native bees and their roles in berry crop production. Before joining the MSU community, he served as president of Stony Brook University in New York. He earned his B.A. in biological sciences from the University of Chicago, his medical degree from Harvard Medical School and his resident-physician training at Massachusetts General Hospital. He took a fellowship in infectious diseases at Washington University and soon became a professor in two departments, medicine and molecular microbiology.

We have asked Dr. Stanley to talk about his experience so far as MSU's president and actions he is taking to strengthen it. We hope he will also share his thoughts on the role retirees can play in continuing to support and serve the university.

We are very pleased to welcome Dr. Stanley to our May MSURA meeting. In addition to listening to Dr. Stanley, attendees will enjoy good fellowship, help elect officers, meet the scholarship winners, celebrate the volunteer of the year and more.
