VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

If you are looking for meaningful opportunities to serve others during the COVID19 situation, the East Lansing Primetime program is referring people who want to help register as a volunteer to call homebound seniors who would like to be called. To register they can use the link below to the Tri County Office on Aging (TCOA) to reach out to recipients of Meals on Wheels . TCOA is trying to reduce exposure to this vulnerable population of seniors who receive MOW, so they will only deliver meals weekly rather than daily. They will be receiving frozen meals they can heat up. TCOA appreciates the support of those willing to help with calls.

The first step to volunteering is to register as a volunteer at <u>www.tcoa.org/volunteer</u>. They will process applications and reach out to people as quickly as they can. A simple phone call can help people feel connected to the outside world. If possible it would be great if MSU Retirees could participate.







For people finding it difficult to afford pet food during these challenging times, Ingham County Animal Control & Shelter and The Cat Ambassador, with support of the Okemos Community Church Food Bank, have created a Pet Food Bank.

Food for one week (cat or dog) will be available. Delivery is by cart to your car and social distancing is mandatory.

Wednesdays, 10 PM – Noon Okemos Community Church parking lot (Home of the Okemos Food Bank) 4734 Okemos Road Saturdays, Noon – 2 PM Meridian Township Central Park Pavilion, off Okemos and Central Park Roads.

Purchases of a bag(s) of cat food (3.5 or 4 pounds preferred) or dog food can be made either in the store, or on line (be sure to give instructions to place the on-line donation into the donation bin). For safety reasons, only items purchased from the store can be placed in their donation bins.

*Other food donations can be taken to Ingham County Animal Control Shelter, 600 Buhl St., Mason where there is a donation bin, or to any Pet Food Bank event.
