### Fraud prevention topic of Nov. meeting

Fraud schemes have been on the increase nationally over the last several years. These schemes continue to



evolve and people continue to become victims. What can we do to protect ourselves from being a victim to these schemes?

Tom Holt, director of the MSU School of Criminal Justice, will present

some of the schemes and what we can

do to identify them and how we can protect ourselves.

Holt's research focuses on computer hacking, malware, and the role of the internet in facilitating all manner of crime and deviance. His work has been published in various journals including Crime and Delinguency, Deviant Behavior, the Journal of Criminal Justice, and Youth and Society. Holt has three degrees from the University of Missouri, including his Ph.D.

### Wild bees & how we can help at Dec. meeting

Dr. Rufus Issacs will be sharing his vast knowledge of honey bees with us on Monday, Dec. 14. In recent decades

the populations have been declining. What can we do to support them? What are the affects on our food crops? Isaacs will answer these questions and more about these important species.

Isaacs is a professor and extension specialist in the Department of Entomology at MSU, where he has worked for the past two decades. His research program explores insect ecology and behavior to develop insect management practices for sustainable crop production. Pest management challenges are addressed by testing new reduced-risk insecticides, developing new pest control tools and tactics, and integrating them into established integrated pest management programs. The lab also focuses on crop pollination, with emphasis on the biology and conservation of native bees and their roles in berry crop production.

Dr. Haque is a medical director of Faith Haven Senior Care Center and offers subacute care at the Ingham County Extended Care Facility. He has a scholarly interest in preventing polypharmacy and falls in the elderly.

around us. The number of people needing our assistance has not diminished. It has increased. There is greater unemployment. There are children needing meals. There are families on the brink of eviction.

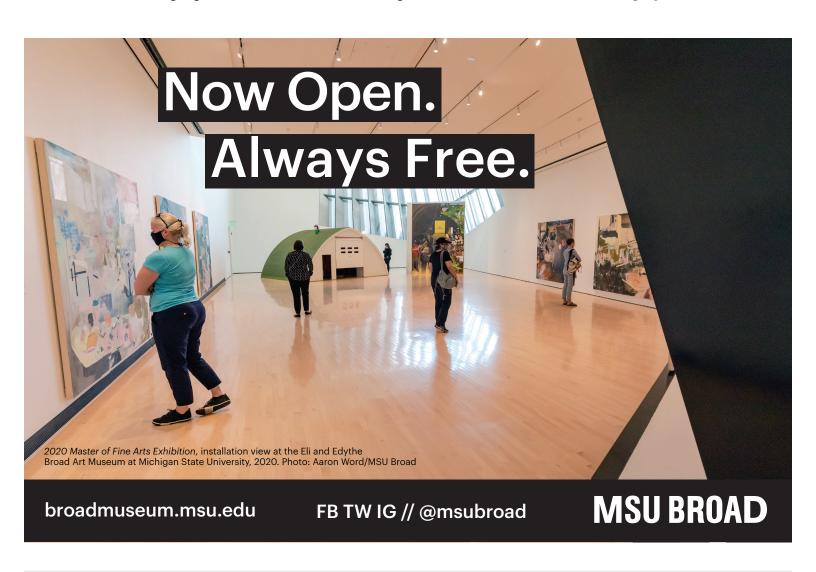
We as an MSU community are so much more important than we

## Next steps for new Humana plans

MSU's Open Enrollment season closes Oct. 31. You should have had the opportunity to review the Humana Enrollment Kit, as well as attend a virtual

presentation and ask your specific questions about the new plans.

For those of you that are participating in a 2021 Humana plan, here are a few next steps to anticipate:

- 1. By the middle of December, watch for a plain white envelope in the mail with your Humana Medical Identification Card.
- 2. Once you receive your card, if you have mail order prescriptions, log into the Humana website or call Humana to validate and set up your prescription mail order.
- 3. After you receive your card, and if you have mail order prescriptions, Humana will also be mailing you a letter letting you know if you need to take action on any of your medications to be prepared for the transitions in 2021.
- 4. If you are participating in the Humana Group Medicare Advantage PPO plan, explore the SilverSneakers benefit. SilverSneakers is a total health and physical activity program included in the plan at no extra cost. This includes access to online fitness classes, as well as free access to workout facilities such as the YMCA, Snap Fitness and Planet Fitness, for when you feel comfortable going back into the gym again. Learn more at www.silversneakers.com.
- 5. While MSU's open enrollment period is coming to a close, other companies' open enrollment periods are still underway. It is critical that if you enrolled in the Humana Group Medicare Advantage PPO plan with MSU, but your spouse is covered through another employer, you review this coverage carefully to ensure you are not enrolled in more than one Medicare Advantage plan, which is prohibited and could result in a loss of coverage.

### Time to get your free flu shot, other vaccines at MSU Pharmacies

MSU HealthTeam Clinical Center and Olin Health Center Pharmacies are offering free flu shots via drive-



Vaccinations free to MSU retirees include Flu, Shingles (SHINGRIX) and Tdap. through several days until the end of the year. To check the dates, visit **pharmacy. msu.edu/.** No appointment is necessary for the drive-through flu shots, and the location for the event is the MSU Pavilion.

The pharmacy is also offering the Tdap vaccine for

adults, 18 years and older. Tdap protects against tetanus, diphtheria and pertussis or whooping cough. CDC recommends one dose of Tdap for adults who have never received it.

Another vaccination free to MSU retirees is Shingles (SHINGRIX).

Talk to a pharmacist to learn what is best for your vaccination needs and to set up an appointment by calling 517-353-4930. You can visit the Clinical Center Pharmacy during the following business hours: Mondays through Fridays from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.

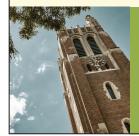


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### **Lessons on Investing – Did you know?**

### Straight to the Point

Market Update - Despite some recent selling, stocks have generally held up well as we head towards the US elections. Bond markets have also been remarkably steady in recent months, aided by the Fed's pledge to keep short-term rates near zero for the foreseeable future, and generally tame inflation readings. As summer has drawn to an end, we expect the failure of the government to implement further fiscal support to weigh on markets in the short-term and to be a modest drag on late Q3 and early Q4 economic readings. After the elections though, we expect the clarity on the composition of government will spur some increased level of confidence for investors, regardless of the election outcome.

Investment Implications - Stock market volatility has remained high and picked up a little bit recently, as expected. Given the continued uncertainty around COVID and the elections, we made some recent moves to marginally de-risk portfolios. We continue to see a path towards further medical advancements in the coming few months and strongly believe that once the elections are settled a top priority for whomever wins will be the introduction of further fiscal support for the economy. We continue to expect a gradually improving global economy as we head into 2021 and certainly as the new year progresses. We favor diversification both between asset classes and across sectors, and see stocks doing better than bonds over the coming 12-18 months.
